- Developed sector leading practice in Equity, Equalities and Inclusion
- Successfully deployed 44,700 I-pads
- Implemented the Numeracy Strategy to improve outcomes for learners
- Further embedded Learning through play guidance and pedagogy



- Improved the skills of our teachers through engagement in the Teachers' charter
- Improved Leadership of Equity strategies & reduced poverty-related stigma

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• The gap in attainment levels between the most and least advantaged young people in Edinburgh schools has narrowed across almost all cohort measures according to the exam results published last week.

 S4- the gap in the key measure of 'pupils attaining at least five Nationals' is at its lowest level in five years.

 S5 - percentage of young people in the least advantaged 20% gaining three or more Highers, up by 10% compared to 2022 and 13% better when considered against 2019 levels

 S6 cohort - pattern of reducing the gap continues with a narrowing in the one, three and five Higher measures when compared to the 2022 and 2019 data
