Self-evaluation has shown that this is in response to pupil wishes. 3 key areas – Global Citizenship, Sustainable Development in Education, Outdoor Learning. 3	Overview of Session 23/24	S Kelly, Head of Education shared a powerpoint detailing the work that has been done in 2022-23 in several areas including wider achievement, outdoor learning, health and wellbeing, empowered learning and attainment gains in all 3 school sectors. Significant advances have been made in closing the attainment gap – however this remains an area for continuous improvement.
